Chief Boshears began his law enforcement career as correctional officer with the Burnet County Sheriff's Office in October of 2000. During his corrections career, Chief Boshears would serve as a shift supervisor and training officer. Chief Boshears credits the jail administrator who hired him with teaching him the first and one of the most important lessons of his law enforcement career, acting in a firm, fair, and consistent manner. Chief Boshears graduated from the police academy in February of 2004. Chief Boshears became a patrol deputy with the sheriff's office in August of 2004. Chief Boshears was hired a patrol officer with the City of Granite Shoals in February of 2006. During his career with the City of Granite Shoals, Chief Boshears has served as a K-9 handler, patrol sergeant, criminal investigation captain, and Chief of Police.
